## **Nurse's Note:**

How much sleep do children Need?

The #1 tip for children is to follow a nightly routine, keeping bedtime and wake times consistent from night to night. A bedtime ritual makes it easier for your child to relax, fall asleep and sleep through the night.

Suggested sleep totals:

4 year old	11.5-12 hours
5-6 year old	10.5-11 hours
7-9 year old	10-10.5 hours
10-14 year old	9-10 hours
Adolescents	8.5-9 hours

Televisions, gaming systems and phones in bedrooms are a frequent cause of sleepiness and inattention during the school day.

A routine works best for most people, so, use a schedule. Big calendars that are colorful and bright stand out so everyone can see that all of you are busy and that is okay!

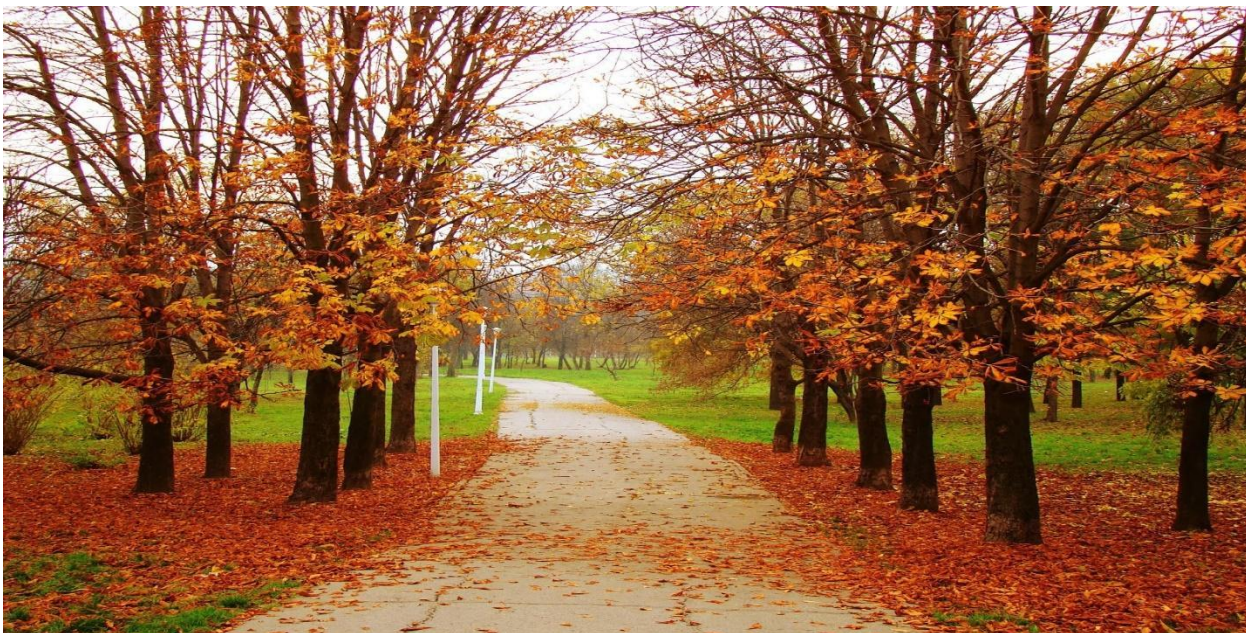

## **Coleman's Corner...**

**Greetings! Hopefully, all of you are enjoying the cooler Fall weather. That being said, please be mindful of what your children are wearing to school. Beverly students participate in recess everyday and should be dressed appropriately for the outdoors.**

**Beverly still follows the 3R's: Be respectful. Be responsible. Be ready. To date, we have received approximately forty (40) disciplinary referrals. Referrals range from inappropriate communication to failure to follow directives or disruptive behavior. Please continue to have discussions, with your children, about what is appropriate behavior.**

**Beverly has been assigned a new Attendance Champion, Mr. Larry Smith. Mr. Smith will be tracking attendance and addressing those who have chronic or habitual absenteeism. Mr. Smith will be reaching out to parents regarding truancy and unexcused absences. Please remember, students will only be excused for personal illness or attending a funeral. Vacation, family emergency, mental health days and transportation issues are all considered unexcused. Please make sure you are getting your children to school everyday and on time.**

**Dismissal is improving....but there is still room for more improvement, Please do not enter the parking lot until 3:10 p.m. Early vehicles tend to cause a traffic jam. Additionally, Urgent Care is still requesting that our parents do not use their parking lot for drop off or pick up. The Glanzman fire lane is only to be used for our school/daycare buses. The only personal vehicles that should be entering the Glanzman lot are those of our preschool students. Those vehicles should be parking in the lower lot, exiting the vehicle and escorting their children to the preschool doors. Please help us to ensure the safety, of all of our children, by following the policies.**
